## ETBI Bliain na Gaeilge Our Ambassadors





**Mícheál Ó Muircheartaigh** A native of Dingle, County Kerry, Micheál O Muircheartaigh has succeeded Micheál O Hehir as the quintessential voice of the G.A.A. This much-loved former teacher, broadcaster, author and raconteur first came to prominence following the famed, Polo Grounds All Ireland Final of 1947 and for many years afterwards the instantly recognisable voice could be heard commentating on minor matches, as Gaeilge. He was President of Gaelscoileanna for a while in the early '80's and was Earlamh ar Oireachtas na Gaeilge when it was held in Dingle in 1992. As everybody knows Micheál has his own original style of commentating and it is this remarkable talent which allows him to turn every match into an epic tale which endears him to all.



**Bláthnaid Ní Chofaigh** Born in Canada and raised in the Meath Gaeltacht of Rath Cairn, Bláthnaid learned to be confident and loyal to the language. Says she of the Irish language, "We realized that we were different from others in the county and we were very proud of that." She spent years working in radio and television for RTÉ since she was 19. While most of her broadcasting work is through English, Irish is certainly central to her everyday life. She currently presents 'Nationwide' but in the past she has presented programmes such as *Echo Island*, *Elections*, *Afternoon Show*, Irish language programs, special events including *The Visit of the Tall Ships*, *The President Clinton Visit* and many more. She is proud to have raised her four children through Gaeilge and recognising that the Irish language is part of our identity!



**Séamus Ó Scanláin** Séamus Ó Scanláin is from Indreabhán in Conamara and he is of ETB alumni, having received his education there - in primary and secondary school. He graduated with honors, BA in Communication, from Acadamh na hOllscolaíochta Gaeilge, NUI Galway, in 2014. Séamus has been a Program Director on the staff of RTÉ Raidió na Gaeltachta for a number of years, reading news for the station and RTÉ RadioONE, RTÉ 2FM and RTÉ LyricFM, as well as presenting and producing music, current affairs and talk shows. He also presents the folk music competition 'Glór Tíre' with Aoife Ní Thuairisg on TG4 and is an actor on television series for young people produced by Telegael and other local

companies for TG4. He has a keen interest in folk and traditional music, as well as technology.

**Bláthnaid Treacy** One of the country's fastest rising stars, Bláthnaid Treacy currently hosts the National Lottery and RTÉ 2FM's popular National Chart Show (Fridays, 8-10pm), bilingually counting down the top thirty tunes of the week. She's a regular contributor to RTÉ's ratings favourite, The Today Show, frequently stepping in to cover lead presenting duties. The Bray native is a Gaeilgeoir and had worked on TG4's travel show O Tholg go Tolg before she landed her gig on RTE's Two Tube. Her love for the Irish language is very clear. She said: 'It's so intrinsically us, no one else speaks this language. It belongs to us. It doesn't matter if you make mistakes, use whatever words you have. 'Mix it in with English, go for it! 'As long as you're making an effort, I think that's the most important thing. The language doesn't just belong to people who can speak it fluently, it belongs to people who can't even speak

#### **NOTE TO SCHOOLS**

- Schools are encouraged to participate in as many Bliain na Gaeilge events as possible. ETBI is cognisant of the challenges of the current climate but we believe that the Bliain na Gaeilge programme will enhance positivity to your school
- Registration forms for Bliain na Gaeilge must be signed by principal/DP and submitted by 23rd October 2020 (to gaeilge@etbi.ie)
- Each school will decide at local level who will go forward to National level.
- Each school is encouraged to submit one junior and senior entry.
- When submitting entries by email, insert competition name in subject box of email.
- Entries may be individual or group efforts (except where specified)
- Schools are invited to participate in as many events as they wish.
- There is no limit on number of entries per school for *Féile Foghlama*. Quality control at school level is advised.

#### NOTE TO STAFF FACILITATOR(S)

- Through the senior management team, convene a committee of volunteers as early as possible to begin planning for the school year
- Meetings should occur on a regular basis throughout the year.
- The suggested timelines for preparation on the calendar are a guide
- It is hoped that this will mostly be a student-led initiative
- Facilitators should encourage the student committee to be as proactive as possible in planning, promoting, organising and running events. Let us know how various activities are progressing by posting on Twitter using the hashtag #SpraoiSanETB

#### NOTE TO STUDENT COMMITTEE

- The *Bliain na Gaeilge student committee* provides an opportunity to engage in a student-leadership role in your school.
- The committee will be ultimately be responsible for the planning, promoting, organising and running of events with the consent of the school management.
- The committee should nominate a chairperson and then delegate responsibilities to the other members.
- Teamwork is at the heart of this project and commitment to your team is essential
- Schools may organise a number of committees to oversee events

#### ADJUDICATION PROCESS

- Entries from Irish-medium and English-medium schools will be adjudicated separately. Prizes are available in each competition for both contexts.
- An adjudication panel, appointed by the ETBI Bliain na Gaeilge Committee, will judge each entry on its own merits. Criteria will be outlined on supplementary information distributed to schools.

#### **PRIZES**

- The ETBI Bliain na Gaeilge Committee may, at its discretion, award up to four prizes, or no prize. The Award Committee's decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Prizes will be outlined in supplementary information distributed to schools.
   Prizes include prizemoney for the school to support the development of Irish language and Culture in the school, trophies and certificates.
- All participating schools will be awarded a certificate of participation
- The award winner(s) will be requested to provide a brief report to ETBI on how their award was utilised within twelve months of the competition. A template reporting form will be provided.
- Prize winners will be invited to an official prize-giving ceremony at a time when Public Health allow such a gathering.

#### PERMISSIONS & CONSENT

- By submitting an entry to an ETBI Bliain na Gaeilge event/competition, you (student/group/class/staff) confirm to ETBI that:
- Your name(s) and school may be used by ETBI and ETBs for the sole purpose of identifying you as the creator(s) of your entry and/or as a winner of the ETBI competition.
- Your entry and any associated images, including photographs, may be used by ETBI and ETBs for promotional purposes only, e.g. a news story on websites, as a news story in an ETB report/magazine/press release.
- All personal data provided as part of the entry conditions of the competition will be retained by ETBI for twelve months after the closing date of the competition and used only for the purposes outlined above.
- The Principal or Deputy Principal has certified the authenticity of, and compliance with, ETBI's terms and conditions, for each entry from their school or college.
