Interview with Irish Independent Education Editor Katherine Donnelly

Provision Mapping to Deliver Excellence in Education

In a groundbreaking project spanning 140 ETB Community Colleges across the ETB Sector, provision mapping is set to deliver excellence in education across our post primary school network by supporting inclusive school improvement.

Led by ETBI and supported by a network of dedicated coordinators in each ETB, new provision mapping resources, workshops and networks will be established to empower school leaders to identify strengths and areas for development in education provision so they can plan and allocate resources to deliver better outcomes for all their students.

ETB Community leads Ukrainian response

With almost 18,000 Ukrainian students currently enrolled in Irish schools, the ETB community has shown leadership in the effort to integrate students from Ukraine into the Irish education system where a 91% enrolment rate among Ukrainian children aged 5-18 is the most successful in Europe. From ETB coordination of the Regional Education and Language Teams (REALTs) to the very human response and supports offered locally by ETBs, we hear about one school's experience.

ETB Schools ethos gathers pace

Since the landmark ETBI Patrons' Framework on Ethos was launched a year ago, this multi-denominational and equality-based approach to education has been blazing a trail with students and staff across all ETB schools and beyond. Led by ETBI and supported by a sector-wide network of committed ethos coordinators, initiatives have included a monthly podcast, training for 83 new ETB staff and over 200 student teachers as well as the introduction of learning networks and self-evaluation tools.
