The Creative Ireland Vision

Puts creativity at the heart of public policy to allow every person in Ireland the opportunity to realise their creative potential.

What is Creative Youth?

To provide our young people (0-24 years) with the opportunity to engage in creativity in both education and out-of-school settings.

The Creative Youth Plan 2023-2027 – led by DTCAGSM in partnership with DEY, DCDE, DFHERIS and Arts Council

Local Creative Youth Partnerships (LCYP's) were established to encourage collaboration at a community level and to target the most disadvantaged and seldom-heard children. They are centred in ETB's and supported and co-funded by DEY, DTCAGSM, and DCDE.

Since 2019, LCYP's have been funded with over €4.1 million, with a further €1.48 million allocated for 2025.

Local Creative Youth Partnership



By establishing and building LCYP's, we aim to develop:

- Collaborative plans across local communities and between youth groups, public services and creative, cultural and art settings, organisations and practitioners;
- new local creative initiatives, targeting different groups more effectively to ensure wider coverage;
- youth workers critical role supporting creative citizenship and cultural democracy for young people



What LCYPs do

Engage young people in their communities to develop, implement and evaluate innovative creative projects.

LCYPs work with **Hub na nÓg** and undertake "voice of the child" training to ensure the voices of young people are reflected in it's programming.

The initiative has gone from strength to strength and will continue to support collaboration, build new relationships and provide greater opportunities for young people (especially those often less heard) to experience the joy of creativity.





Roma Project in Tralee

Aim: to support children and young people of Roma heritage in Tralee to express themselves creatively, promoting understanding between their community and other communities.

Projects to date and ongoing:

- Youth voice consultations; Visual art workshops;
- Sweatshirt upcycling workshops
- Wall based mural; Ancient scarf design;
- Romani dancing workshops
- Celebration International Romani Day April 2025
- Workshops planned in drama, podcasting and film as part of other Tralee LCYP initiatives

Outcome: Trust, understanding, fun, team working, creative confidence, friendship.

Inclusive Dance Club

Limerick Clare LCYP partnered with **Dance Limerick** to run an inclusive dance club in 2025 following a successful 2024 summer camp.

Weekly workshops, facilitator training, and expanded summer camps.

Classes are held at Dance Limerick Studio for children aged 7–16, with plans to expand into rural Limerick and Clare.

The project aligns with LCYP's goal of **promoting inclusivity, adaptability, and long-term community engagement**. It will also connect with [LCYP Creative Hubs](#) to further extend access in rural areas.

Bhí smaoinítí na nÓg, samplaí dá saothar cruthaitheach agus faisnéis faoi chlubanna óige faoi stiúir oibrithe deonacha le feiceáil ann.

Tá obair déanta taobh le taobh acu i gcomhpháirtíocht le páirtithe leasmhara chun taispeántas a chruthú agus an tionscnamh nuálaíoch seo a sheoladh in Áras Éanna, Inis Oírr. Beidh an taispeántas seo á reáchtáil ag na comhpháirtí cruthaitheacha in *Áras Éanna* le linn mí na Márta. Beidh sé oscailte d'aon bhall den phobal atá fiosrach faoin tionscnamh nua seo.



Creative Families

Creative Families was created to strengthen family connections and provide a platform for artistic expression. Families collaborated with two artists to nurture creativity, enhance communication, and foster relationships within a family environment. Over four weeks participants engaged in a series of hands-on art activities, culminating in the creation of a collaborative artwork.

The project fostered collaboration and effective communication among family members and strengthened family bonds through shared creative experiences. Additionally, it positively influenced the mental health of all family members, allowing them to express themselves creatively through art.
